Concession Stand:

Cheerleaders and Band:

A discussion was had about how to get the cheerleaders to cheer at the games. Theresa Brummer approached Shelly to ask what she would need to get a squad started. At this time, the QB club is not able to financially help the squad start up, but would be willing to give Gold Cards to the cheerleaders that could be sold. Money earned can be used for start up costs. Theresa will bring this proposal to Shelly.

Theresa will also talk to the Pep Band director to see if there is any way the band members could stay the entire game.

Eagen Scrimmage:

9th and 10th graders will be given \$5 each to eat at a restaurant after the scrimmage. JV and varsity will have Chanticlear pizza, BWW, watermelon, treats provided by parent volunteers, and Gatorade in the commons area after the scrimmage.

After Game Parties/ Pre Game Meals:

E-mails will be going out asking for help for those after game parties that don't have a host/hostess and helpers yet. The e-mail will explain the details of an after game party (it can be held in the commons area and not at a player's home and that there is \$300 for each host/hostess to go towards the cost of the party).

Sheila, Dona, Deb, and Theresa are meeting to decide which day and what will be served for the pre game meal.

Mom's Club:

The Quarterback Club will purchase 2 buttons for each player to be given to the player's parents to wear for Family Night. Theresa Brummer made a motion to have the club pay for the cost of the buttons, and Deb Pipenhagen made a second. Motion carried.

Head Coach's Report:

The first day of practice went very well. 155 kids are on the team so far – this is the highest number of players since 2003.

The Mississippi 8 coaches met at Elk River. Evan Bye distributed pink mouth guards (donated by Play It Again) for all the players to wear during the season, as a tribute to his brother, Glen Bye. The mouthguards will be worn, for those who would like, during the Elk River/Zimmerman game.

Coach Cross spoke to the Zimmerman football team on Thursday about grief.

Coach Cross had a “manager’s meeting” this week to communicate his expectations for the 8 football managers and their responsibilities. Coach Cross made a motion to purchase a sweatshirt and t-shirt for each manager. Sharon Brenny made a second. Motion carried.

The team is in need of a new end zone camera. The cost is approx. \$6,000. John Barth will pay for some of the cost and the rest can be financed over a 2-year period. Theresa Brummer made a motion to have the club pay for the camera, and Deb Pipenhagen made a second. Motion carried.

New Business:

The 9th graders will have pizza on Thursday as a reward for being the grade that sold the most fertilizer during the spring.

John Barth has asked if a media student can work the scoreboard this year. Theresa Brummer will ask a student. This position will not be a paid position.

Amy Madsen has been working with the brick company, and they will make an order of bricks even if we do not have 10. Amy will make an order form for the bricks. The forms will be added to the programs as inserts. The money collected for this fundraiser will be used for scholarships. There will be two dates during the year parents will need to get their order forms in by.

Kevin Heston will be making stickers with the name of a “sponsor of the game” that will go on the front of each of the programs. Furniture and Things and Twin Cities Orthopedics are two of the sponsors so far. Amy Madsen is working on this project.
